Trembling with horror stood Mrs. Byrde, Unable to utter a single word, She staggered and fell in the nearest chair, On the left of the Junior Warden there; And scarcely noticed, so loud the groan,, That the chair was made of human bones. Of human bones! On grinning skulls That ghastly throne of horror rolls, Those skulls, the skulls that Morgan bore; Those bones, the bones that Morgan wore. His scalp across the top was flung His teeth around the arms were strung; Never in all romance was known Such uses made of human bones. There came a pause - a pair or paws Reached through the floor, up sliding doors, And grabbed the unhappy candidate! How can I without tears relate The lost and ruined Morey's fate? Rob Morris was a prominent American poet and Freemason. He served as Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Kentucky in 1858-9. He also created the first ritual for what was to become the Order of the Eastern Star.
