The Officers of Columbia Lodge No. 25 were installed in afternoon ceremonies on January 9, 2016.


Lodge Almoner

Historian Corner High Twelve

When the craft is often called to refreshment by the Junior Warden at "high twelve" it is generally taken to signify midday or noon.

The Latin word "nonus" originally referred to the ninth hour of the day, that is, nine hours after sunrise. In the Medieval church it referred to the middle hour between midday and sunset, that is, about three o'clock P.M. Over the course of time it came to refer to any part of the middle of the day, and finally to twelve o'clock ("noon".)



The origin of our "High Twelve" is uncertain, but it is probable that it goes back to a time before "noon" was generally used for twelve o'clock; the "high" doubtless refers to the sun, which at that time was at its

highest point in the sky.
