

Historian Corner

As we approach another contentious election, Masons can look forward to their Lodge as a refuge from the political divisions of society. It seems fitting however, as an expression of our

shared love of country, to recognize that Uncle Sam, one of the most iconic images of the USA, was "born" 200 years ago this year.



The inspiration for the iconic Uncle Sam is said to be Brother Daniel Rice. The first use of Uncle Sam was actually in 1816 however, seven years before Rice was born, but it was his portraval of "Yankee

Dan" in top-hat, red-and-white striped pants, and his tailored goatee that captured the imagination of midnineteenth century America and inspired the period's political cartoonists.

Rice was twenty-one before he ran off with the circus and created his clown persona. Rice was hailed as the first widely recognized American clown. Breaking the stylized mold of European diamond-clad harlequins and buffoonery clowns, Rice amassed a small fortune while commanding the unheard of sum of a thousand dollars a week in salary. He ran for President in 1868, believing he could wrest the Republican nomination from Ulysses S. Grant based solely on his popularity. Stripped of his caricature image, Rice suffered personal ridicule and rejection that he had never experienced when performing as his alter-ego. Bro. Rice was a member of Lake Erie Lodge #347 in
