

Historian Corner

<u>NOT ALL QUALIFY</u> In California, saloon keepers and bar keepers were disqualified from becoming Freemasons.

Connecticut Masons disqualified any "Stupid Atheist" or Libertine from membership.

Arizona disqualified "Eunuchs and Illiterates". In all fairness, Arkansas, California, Connecticut, Minnesota, New York, and South Dakota also disqualified eunuchs in 1917. Georgia and Wisconsin disqualified them without using the snippy word. They simply required candidates to have their "Entire Organs" and be "Unmutilated".

Sumo wrestlers would have a problem in 1917 in Florida, where candidates were deemed disqualified for health reasons, if they were not "their due weight".

Quasimodo had better stick to bell-ringing if he lived in Georgia. They disqualified hunchbacks, but in West Virginia, they were eligible. Illegitimacy of birth did not disqualify in Georgia, but it did in Virginia.

South Dakota had a prejudice against any man with a "Cork Leg". Apparently South Dakotans had more of a problem with pirates than Masons did in Missouri, for cork legs did not disqualify applicants in the "Show Me" state.

Although not explicitly stated, politicians in New York might have a problem being elected to a local Masonic Lodge. The State's Grand Lodge disqualified "Scandalous men" and Fools.

Wyoming turned a blind eye to any man with a "Glass Eye". They likewise disqualified a man for shooting himself in the hip with the loaded revolver carried in his pocket while riding.
