Brothers: Greetings from the East! The brotherhood has seen fit to grace me with another year as Worshipful Master of Columbia Lodge. I sincerely thank you for the opportunity to continue the momentum we built this past year. To all those that made 2012 a year to remember, I am in your debt. Not only did we continue our standards of excellence, we emerged from the Lodge room to create a superb presence in the community.

One of the first things you may have noticed this year is that our dues went up again. Some of you have even returned feedback with your dues payments. For those who would like to understand why this has occurred, let me explain. Late in 2011, I analyzed the budget of the Lodge and the Building Association. Since a major tenant left our building in 2007, the Building Association has operated at a heavy deficit. In these difficult economic times, it has been a challenge to find a suitable replacement for that tenant. It was decided that, beginning in 2012, dues would be raised by \$10 in each of the next 3 years. The goal of this was to increase the rent the Lodge pays to the Building Association so that they may operate with a balanced budget. Despite these increases, Columbia Lodge continues to have some of the lowest dues, given that we own our own building. The Lodge and the Building Association are inseparable & I feel that ultimately, we, as brothers of Columbia are charged with the financial stability of both. Having said all that, with the 2013 increase and the addition of a small tenant this year, I am pleased to report that the Building Association will begin the year with a balanced budget for the first time since 2007.



IMPORTANT INFO

This will be a year of continued community involvement & Lodge improvement. However, for the first few months, our focus will be on membership. We have a dozen men, awaiting entrance into our fraternity. Yes, you read that right. Additionally, most of these men are young and have no Masonic backgrounds. It is an exciting challenge to welcome these new brethren. We will need help, though. If anyone would like to step up and be a mentor to one of these new members, your assistance will be GREATLY appreciated.
