TRAVELING MAN IN MASONRY

In the ancient world of Operative Masonry, the masons were often required to move from job to job much as in our modern time. It was further explained that

ancient master masons, just as 1st class masons of today of today, were more likely to travel great distances than those of lesser ranks (FC & EA). Due to their experience (and today, usually a membership in the labor union representing the craft) they could move freely from job to job. Those doing so were normally members of a Masonic guild, whose members would, if known, vouch for the qualifications of (or recommend) another 'traveling' mason.

In speculative masonry we as Master Masons may freely move from Lodge to Lodge (either visiting or moving membership) and upon proper avouchment or by testing be found worthy to attend another Master Mason Lodge. This is much the same as moving from one job to another or from one ancient Masonic guild to another.

Also, a Master Mason is a traveler from west to east, as east is the where the sun comes up, hence the source of light. This is why the master sits in the East, because it is the source of light. Thus, being a traveling man represents our journey from darkness to Masonic light (enlightenment). We "traveled" symbolically when we were raised to the sublime degree of Master Mason. Remember the words, "It will be necessary for you to travel."

In Masonry we are told to seek the light. Light in Masonry is knowledge and from that knowledge comes information and understanding.

Sadly, in the past few months, four of our brothers have been called to the Grand Lodge on High.

Brother Kenneth E. MacMurtry

passed away on Thursday August 3, 2022 after a fall at home. He was born in Rutland, VT on March 19, 1936. Ken was raised in Orient #62 in 1981. He grew up in East Hartford. He graduated from East Hartford High School in 1955. He received an Associate Degree from Hillyer College, now part of the University of Hartford. In 1958 Ken joined the United States Marine Corps and was discharged in 1962. Ken was a dedicated worker for the U.S. Post Office in Hartford for many years. Ken was a member of several organizations including the Glastonbury Elks Lodge 2202 where he served as Chaplain and the National Path Finders. Ken also was a speaker, at different locations, for Alcoholics Anonymous.

Brother Ronald C. Christensen passed away on Thursday August 11, 2022. He was born in East Hartford, CT, on January 22,1936. Ron was raised in Orient #62 in 1974. He graduated from East Hartford High School and married Loretta Calabrese in 1955. Ron was a proud US Navy aviation veteran, serving his country aboard the aircraft carrier USS Forrestal. He worked for Pratt & Whitney Aircraft throughout his professional career, retiring in 1992 as Operations Manager of its Middletown, CT Plant. He enjoyed his lakefront summer home in the woods of northern Maine, with a view of Mount Katahdin.

Brother Philip A. Grasso passed away on Sunday December 4, 2022. He was born in Glastonbury on June 28, 1936. Phil was raised in Columbia #25 in 1989. Phil served as SD in 1992. He resided on the family farm. Phil was a graduate of Glastonbury High School class of 1955. After graduation he worked at Midway Garage in South Glastonbury, served in the US Army at Fort Lewis, Washington and became a postman at the Glastonbury Postal Service from 1961-1992. In retirement he fulfilled a lifelong dream of restoring "old cars" specifically Model A Fords that put his Master Mechanic skills to the test each day. He was in his element when he designed and built an 85 foot long, 3 bay barn/garage at the back of his property.

Brother Henry H. Hunt, III passed away on Friday September 9, 2022. He was born on March 7,1943 in Glastonbury where he spent his life. Henry was raised in Columbia #25 in 1973. He had a long career as an engineer at Pratt & Whitney, retiring after 30+ years. He would entertain people for hours with stories about his time at Pratt & Whitney, the history of his hometown, of the fox hunts out of Manchester and silly stories of useless information. He was known to friends as a walking encyclopedia or "Mr. Glastonbury". Everyone who knew Hank felt his big heart, kindness, generosity, and smile.
