# **Bikes For Books?**

For newer members and friends, and for those of us who may have forgotten, we enclose the explanation of our Bikes For Books program. There have been few changes since this was originally written we think but this a view from the past.

### Old Town Lodge Bikes For Books Program

Old Town Lodge 751 in Winston-Salem is the proud sponsor of a project to encourage reading improvement in the public schools. OTL believes that the ability to read opens the door to most of what is important in life. As Will Rogers said "A man only learns in two ways, one by reading, and the other by association with smarter people." — Will Rogers, American humorist and Freemason.

The project began when, at the September stated meeting in 2008 then SW Terry Wooten (now past master), inspired by an article in the Scottish Rite Magazine, proposed that OTL institute a program to encourage reading proficiency in our local schools. The program, as he foresaw it, would involve awarding bicycles to students in the public schools for improvement in reading skills. Many details were to be worked out and the approval and cooperation of the school officials had to be obtained. The lodge agreed, and the fact-finding phase of the project began. At the October meeting he was able to report progress and at the November meeting he reported that principals of four nearby schools were on board with the Idea. The lodge passed a motion to move on with the project and several members immediately subscribed moneys to get it started.

Since that beginning bikes have been awarded each spring to the boy and girl of the  $3^{\rm rd}$  through  $6^{\rm th}$  grade who have made the most progress in reading skills. The winners are determined by the teachers. Brother Wooten did not want to get into that side of the project.

In the beginning the bikes were purchased and displayed in each school's library near the time of the awards. Signs and other publicity were used early in the year to generate interest on the part of the students.

From the outset the teachers reported an improvement in reading skills and interest. This year a slight change in procedure has been made at the suggestion of some of the teachers. The actual bikes to be awarded are put on display in the school libraries near the beginning of the school year. The bikes generate even more enthusiasm than mere signs alone.

Through 2013 forty-one bikes have been awarded. Forty-one because one year presented an outright tie and an "extra" bike was awarded. And today, eight are on display at the schools awaiting the 2014 presentation.

This year there has been a more general interest from other lodges in the project. DDGM Gary Handy has helped to spread the word, and Brother Wooten has visited several lodges in the 26<sup>th</sup> district to promote the idea and serve as a consultant. Brother Wooten is confident that some of these will begin their own Bikes for Books projects soon.





#### **How Many Bikes?**

Unfortunately We do not have the count immediately at hand, but with 41 bikes presented through 2013 plus 5 schools times 2 bikes per schools times 10 years we count for an unaudited number 141 bikes presented.
