VIEW FROM THE SOUTH



My Brothers,

Whenever someone who is not part of our Fraternity asks me about Freemasonry, even if they pointedly ask about the Secrets, I always try to be as forthcoming as I can while staying within the bounds of my Obligations, because I firmly believe that knowledge is the only way to combat the fear which springs from ignorance. To that end, I often find myself perfecting such conversations by quoting a line of the Pubic Ritual I learned while in DeMolay. "While we have secret signs, words, and modes of recognition, we have no secrets from the world so far as our central purposes are concerned." So, I thought I might

take this opportunity to talk about how I think it should be approached.

Let me begin by saying that I might have an unusual take on this, as I'd been attending Pubic and Semi-Pubic Masonic events for nearly a decade before I took my first Degree. Having been to see many Installations, there were a number of things I already knew or guessed at before taking my first Degree. Therefore, I consider that information to be fair game in front of the uninitiated, as well as the implications of the phrase "Freemasonry takes good men and makes them better."

When, if the person in question already has a dim view of us, I'm asked about "the Templar Treasure" or how "Freemasonry secretly runs the world", I tend to point to the brethren. "Yes," I say, "we can count lawyers, doctors, powerful businessmen, and even politicians amongst our present and past members. But those are by no means end-goals or prerequisites for membership. My Lodge counts among it's members engineers, carpenters, landscapers, plumbers, teachers, full-time students, and even those who entered who were already retirees."

Occasionally, someone will ask about why Catholics aren't allowed membership. To this I say, "That may have been the case way back when, I'm not a great Masonic Historian so I wouldn't know, but that's not really the case now. All that's required is that you have a belief in *some form* of Higher Power — what you call it, what form it takes, whether it's singular or multiple, that's all beside the point. In my own Lodge, we actually keep *three* Holy Books on the Alter: a combined Old and New Testament, the Quran, and the Bhagavad Gita. And if you were accepted into my Lodge and found that the Book you follow is not present, you just let us know, we'll find a way to make it happen. We don't concern ourselves with *what* you believe, only *that* you believe."

The Entered Apprentice Charge says that we shouldn't argue with those who don't understand the Fraternity and so ridicule it. But should they seek you out and ask questions, I find that this roadmap works well in attempting to turn a naysayer into an acceptor. Or possibly even a friend into a Candidate.
