#### **VIEW FROM THE SOUTH**



My Brothers,

I saw this at Grand Lodge last month and, being the fan of Star Trek I am, I just had to get it. My first thought on seeing it was "oh cool, the badge of the Grand Lodge of Starfleet", but then I realized "wait a minute, if we had gotten to that point, Starfleet wouldn't have their own Grand Lodge...would it?" So why don't we consider that for a moment – if humanity has progressed to the point of interstellar travel, colonies on other worlds, and even possibly meeting

alien species, and assuming Freemasonry followed, how would the fraternity adapt and regulate itself under those circumstances?

The idea of a "Space Force", a new branch of the military that covers warfare taking place outside the Earth's atmosphere, has been a hot topic recently. Now I *really* don't want to get political here, so let's just say, in our hypothetical future scenario, that there does exist a Starfleet-like branch of the military. If typical missions would last long enough that Brothers wouldn't be able to make it to Earth for bi-weekly meetings (or possibly even then), there would likely be (for lack of better term) Space Lodges which would spring up on bases and ships, much in the same way in which we have Masonic Lodges on Army bases today. So they would probably take much of their rules and regulations by copying those existing Lodges. If they have an Earth-bound headquarters, however, my guess would be that such Lodges would be considered to be under the Grand Lodge which covers the area HQ is in.

Which brings us naturally to the question of jurisdictions and Grand Lodges. Even if we progress into having a single, unified world government, it's unlikely the existing Grand Lodges would be willing to entertain the idea of an overarching Grand Lodge of Earth that's over and above them. So we'd keep existing jurisdictional boundaries and, much like the first Lodges in the American Colonies, new Lodges that pop up in human colonies on other worlds would start likely start out under the jurisdiction of an Earth-bound Grand Lodge until such time as there was enough locally-raised Brothers that a more local Grand Lodge made sense.

Now we come to the possibility of alien life which, just for the sake of argument, let's say exists, we've made contact, and they're peaceful. Some of them might petition to join Freemasonry, and Grand Lodges will have to decide whether they would be allowed. After all, they're decidedly not human. It is my belief that, just as other religions were originally not allowed but were eventually welcomed in, Grand Lodges will recognize the wisdom of welcoming ever more (pardon the pun) alien viewpoints into our society. The ritual may have to be altered slightly to

accommodate non-human physiology, but that's a minor thing. Additionally, we might have such brothers who wish to bring Freemasonry home and create Lodges on their homeworld. At best, this would happen the same as if a new Lodge was being created in a human colony. At worst, it would be like the origins of Prince Hall Freemasonry all over again – a completely separate-yet-identical fraternity is created and would have to be slowly recognized by the Grand Lodges. Either way, though, I have no doubt that they would happen.

And there you have it, my Brothers, just a few thoughts of how a possible future of space exploration and exoplanetary colonization might affect Freemasonry. While it may not be as influential in it as it was during the (first) Age of Exploration, I have no doubt that the fraternity will make its mark and help to shape that final frontier.


