How was 2021 a good year for the Lodge? First and foremost, we were able to meet in person again with regularity after "holding it together" through COVID induced challenges. I cannot overstate how good it is to be with Brothers and Friends again on a regular basis. Second, we finished the year in pretty good financial shape. Thanks to the efforts of those who support their lodge through prompt dues payments, donations, and fundraising (primarily by working at Rentschler Field), we finished the year "in the black". Finally, we finished the year with the same number of members that we started with.

We're starting off 2022 with hope for a good year, too. The challenges (opportunities if you will) facing us this year fall into the same 3 categories of Social, Membership and Money.

The social calendar for the year shows the re-introduction of several of our historical functions, including Irish Night, an Awards Ceremony, and a trip next fall. For membership, we have several inquiries for membership as well as 5 Entered Apprentices and 2 Fellowcraft to conduct degrees for. - 2) Talk up the Fraternity—I'll bet we all know a man who is looking for something in his life that Freemasonry can provide, and we will benefit by getting to share experiences with new members.
- 3) Support the Lodge. Donations of time, talent and money are always gratefully accepted, but we absolutely depend on your dues please pay them promptly! If that is hardship, please allow us to help by letting us know early; we can make arrangements if we know.
