BROTHERHOOD IN ACTION (BIA)

The Manchester Brotherhood in Action (BIA) proudly announces that our annual fundraiser is back after one year off due to the pandemic. Although we will not be holding an in-person breakfast this year, we have decided to hold a fundraiser for the family of Victoriana Diaz from East Hartford, CT. Proceeds will help the family offset expenses incurred from medical bills. The BIA has been in existence since 1987 and has fundraised over \$132,000 in charitable contributions to help children with life threatening illnesses. Volunteer members are from UNICO, Knights of Columbus, Beth Sholom B'nai Israel Brotherhood, and both Manchester Masonic Lodges.

Five-year old Victoriana suffers from a brain cancer called Medulloblastoma. It is an invasive, rapidly growing tumor that spreads through the cerebrospinal fluid. She has had surgeries to remove the tumors and has also undergone numerous chemotherapy and radiation treatments at Boston Children's Hospital and Connecticut Children's Medical Center. With these treatments, Victoriana has endured many side effects including partial hearing loss in one ear as well as speech challenges. Currently undergoing physical and occupational therapy, Victoriana hopes to return to a normal, healthy life in the very near future. In between treatments she enjoys listening and dancing to K-Love Radio with her Mother and Father, Sister, and Brothers.
