#### From the Secretary s Desk By Eric Hoy, Jr.



While at the Grand Lodge session in April, I was requested to pick up a package of material that the Grand Lodge office had determined was taking up too much space in their archives, being either redundant or unnecessary. Once home I took the opportunity to examine the contents.

In the folder marked "126", folded up in an envelope, there are 5 sheets of 102 year-old paper, all dated in January, 1920. Two contain first a request to the Grand Lodge requesting formation of a new lodge to be in Hartford, named

Tuscan #126, along with a list of 61 signatures of Brothers requesting membership in the same. The other three are letters to the Grand Secretary from St. John's #4, Hartford #88 and LaFayette #100, all conveying the same sentiment; that each of those lodges fully – even enthusiastically - supported the formation of that new lodge.

Among the documents in the "145" folder is one that is "only" 58 years old: a certified copy the minutes of the June 9<sup>th</sup>, 1964 Stated Communication of Manchester #73. It is 7 pages long, typed single-spaced, and is much more interesting to read than anything I have ever written. It is inappropriate to divulge any details of that document in this forum, but 4 of those 7 pages document recommendations, comments, and arguments both for and against the formation of a second lodge in Manchester.

Also in that folder is the original dispensation dated in August authorizing, Friendship Lodge U.D. to work. Eventually, the brothers of Tuscan and Friendship joined together to ensure the continuance of both of their heritages.

I was struck by the difference in tone between those two packets of paper, especially in the light of our present situation. We, the brothers of Friendship Tuscan Lodge, are now earnestly engaged in discussions with Manchester #73 about the possibility of merging. There are numerous issues to be addressed. Many are mundane, but a few will excite emotions, perhaps strong ones. All are important, and all deserve thought and discussion.

The merger committees are there to convey and address your thoughts and concerns. The Friendship Tuscan committee consists of Brothers John DiCioccio, David LaFargue and Eric Hoy. Ask them questions; let your feelings, thoughts and concerns be known. Always remember that we come here "to learn to subdue our passions and improve ourselves in masonry"; consider the larger questions of what is best for masonry, what is best for the lodge, and what best serves you on your masonic journey.
