#### From the Secretary s Desk By Eric Hoy, Jr.



My boss circulated an article from the Harvard Business Review the other day – not for the first time, either, since it was originally published in 1990 and re-printed (as a "best of HBR") in 2001. So at least he thinks it's worthwhile. Here's my view (take it or leave it).

Entitled "What Leaders Really Do", it proposes that while management and leadership are completely different things, both

are necessary and complementary. To illustrate the paper's theme, consider the following:

- Management involves planning and budgeting. Leadership involves setting direction.
- Management involves organizing and staffing. Leadership involves aligning people.
- Management provides control & stability and solves problems. Leadership provides motivation.

It got me to thinking about how we – as Masons – demonstrate and develop these skills.

We take a Candidate, sit him down and talk about Masonry. The Management part is explaining the structure and history of our institution and having him fill out the petition correctly so that we can do management stuff to it. The Leadership part is communicating the internal rewards to be gained by experiencing the degrees and the fellowship of our order.

We take a Master Mason and make him an officer. He learns (or improves) management skills by learning his ritual (self-management) and performing the stated duties of a station. His Leadership skills are challenged and developed by aligning his Brothers' talents with opportunities for service (degree cast parts, special events, subordinate officer positions, etc.).

We take a group of Master Masons and make them a Lodge. The Lodge (as a body) makes and keeps a budget, obtains and maintains a place to meet, etc. Lodge Leadership aligns the vision of where it wants to go with the talents and passions of its members.

To what end does all this effort lead? The fulfilment of the promise to "take good men and make them better". It's not easy, but with the Brotherly Love provided by Masonry and everything it entails, I believe that we all turn into better leaders than we were when we started.

Better managers? Judging by an honest self-appraisal of this being so late to our esteemed Trestleboard editor – maybe not.
