

Message from the East

Well, it's almost September, and time to return to Labor. Ask yourself this question – "Do you have your Elevator Speech ready?" Now what's the Master talking about? What is an "elevator speech"? In Marketing, the elevator speech is a quick presentation designed to get someone's interest during the time it takes to wait for and ride on an elevator. This is the pre-pitch to see if the listener is interested in continuing to listen to you.

There is an old story about Aristotle Onassis. A film producer managed to jump into Onassis' waiting limo while trying to pitch a movie. Onassis gave him until the end of the block to convince him to listen further. By the end of the block, the producer convinced Onassis to pitch Five Million Pounds to the film project. THAT's an elevator speech.

Now what, you ask, does that have to do with being a Mason? Everything. So let's say you are in a public venue. Someone looks and sees your ring, or lapel pin, or hat, some other article of clothing with the Square and Compasses, or some other publicly recognized Masonic symbol. They ask you if you are a Mason and what do you guys do. Now is time for the elevator speech. You have around two minutes to get and keep his interest.

I can practically guarantee if that speech includes "It's a system of morality, veiled in allegory and illustrated by symbols" you will have lost them before you get started. They aren't ready to hear that yet. Instead, lead with something like it being "the oldest Fraternity, dedicated to making good men better" and our local charitable involvement. If they ask follow-up questions like what got you involved, or what benefit you get out of it, they've opened the door for further conversation.

However, if their questions tend to Dan Brown, the Templar treasure, the Priory of Sion, or the Illuminati, be polite and explain we have nothing to do with any of those.

So, you answered their questions and now they want more information. DO NOT hand them a petition! We want to keep their interest, not send them running for the hills! Invite them to stop by the Lodge for Fellowship before our next meeting. Direct them to ctfreemasons.net. Give them your email address. You notice I did not suggest giving them your phone number. The goal here is to get them interested enough to submit a petition.

As I mentioned above that it's time to return to Labor. In that aim, we will be presenting an Entered Apprentice Degree on September 19. It will also be our annual inspection. Let's make sure we properly support our candidates that night.

Preamble to the Bill of Responsibilities: Freedom and responsibility are mutual and inseparable; we can ensure enjoyment of the one only by exercising the other. Freedom for all of us depends on responsibility by each of us. To secure and expand our liberties, therefore, we accept these responsibilities as individual members of a free society.

Bill of Responsibilities

- To respect the property of others, both private and public. No one has a right to what is not his or hers. The right to enjoy what is ours depends on our respecting the right of others to enjoy what is theirs.
- ♦ To share with others our appreciation of the benefits and obligations of freedom. Freedom shared is freedom strengthened.
- ♦ To participate constructively in the nation's political life. Democracy depends on an active citizenry. It depends equally on an informed citizenry.
- To help freedom survive by assuming personal responsibility for its defense. Our nation cannot survive unless we defend it. Its security rests on the individual determination of each of us to help preserve it.
- To respect the rights and to meet the responsibilities on which our liberty rests and our democracy depends. This is the essence of freedom. Maintaining it requires our common effort, all together and each individually

There they are. I believe that they are excellent reminders for us as Citizens and Masons.
